The new streamlined electronic reporting system, or e-NTR, utilizes an automated series of simple questions to guide you through the reporting process.

With you, the inventors, in mind, we've significantly decreased the number of data fields to help shorten completion time and focus only on required information.

Our ultimate goal? To help turn your technologies into commercial products that benefit NASA and the Nation by licensing them to companies—and it all starts with an NTR.

What's reportable? Any invention, discovery, improvement, or innovation—whether or not patentable—including (but not limited to) new processes, machines, and compositions of matter, and improvements to, or new applications of, existing processes, machines, manufactures, and compositions of matter. New technologies also include new computer programs, and improvements to, or new applications of, existing computer programs.

When should you report? As soon as you recognize you have a new technology, and definitely before any public disclosure.

Need another incentive to report? You can also earn royalty income if your technologies are licensed and commercialized. (Also, it's the law.)
